What is Title I?

Title I is the largest federal educational program, reauthorized in 2002 as part of the *No Child Left Behind Act of 2001* (NCLB).

Its purpose is to make sure that all children have the opportunity to have a highquality education.

What will Title I do for my child?



Title I funding provides extra help to the students who need it the most. These are the children who are the furthest from meeting the common core state standards that are expected to be met by all students.



Which schools does Title I serve?

The program serves millions of children in elementary and secondary schools every year.

Title I also serves children who attend private schools.

How does our school receive Title I funding?




Funds are provided to schools based on the number of students qualifying for the free/reduced price lunch program.



Title I schools:

Identify the students at their school who need the most educational assistance based on the criteria that school has chosen. Students do NOT have to be from low-income families to receive Title I services.

Have a choice as to how they set up their Title I program, as long as the program helps its students meet academic standards and follows federal guidelines.

Our Title I funds are used to:

Support "targeted" students in each grade level: (Tier 2) Reading Specialist Support

Small group reading support (Tier 1) ASE Teacher Support

Other supports depending on student need and funding available*

*Amount of funding varies each year.



What is the selection criteria?

- Multiple measures/assessments given to all students at each grade level may include:
 - DIBELS & Benchmark Advance Reading Assessments
 - California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) results for 4th/5th

graders

- Classroom Assessments
- Teacher Recommendation

Ongoing...

Students are monitored and reassessed throughout instruction to see if they are able to move out of Title I groups.

Groups are flexible and constantly changing. Teachers collaborate monthly on a formal basis, and more often informally, to discuss student progress. What are the requirements for parental involvement? Parental Involvement Policy



Fundations is a **multisensory** and **systematic** phonics, spelling, and handwriting program that teaches the concepts and skills for letter formation, phonological and phonemic awareness, sound mastery, phonics/word study/and advanced word study, irregular words, vocabulary, fluency, comprehension strategies, and written composition of spelling and handwriting.
